1.3.1. Institution integrates cross cutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and sustainability into curriculam (5)

Response:

The institution strongly believes in the inculcation of cross cutting issues relevant to professional ethics, gender, human values, environment and sustainability for holistic development of students. The course curricula address these issues critically both in the theoretical and pragmatic contexts and instill the ethical values among the students.

<u>Professional Ethics</u> enable the students to use specific capacities and skills to make moral decisions in professional life. It is the part of almost every course of study and students are familiarized with ethical standards from the day they enter into the university. Few examples are:

Gender issues are essential character of curricula that sensitizes students on gender related problems. All the genders (including transgender) are provided equal opportunities in admission, studies and placement.
